

August: Month of the Immaculate Heart of Mary

The Church dedicates the month of August to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. It is a dogma of the Catholic faith that Mary is the Immaculate Conception; that is, in preparation for the Incarnation of the Second Person of the Holy Trinity in her womb, she was conceived without the corruption of sin through the foreseen and infinite merits of her Son, Jesus Christ. Over the centuries, as saints and theologians reflected on how Mary pondered and treasured the sacred events from the life of



Christ in her holy heart, as attested in Scripture, her pure heart was recognized as something to be imitated. Devotion to Our Lady's purity of heart began to flower - so much so that in the 17th century, St. John Eudes promoted it alongside the Sacred Heart of Jesus. Devotion to Immaculate Heart rose to new levels after the apparitions at Fatima. Mary revealed an image of her Immaculate Heart to Lucia, Jacinta, and Francisco. On June 13. 1917, the Blessed Virgin told Lucia that God wished to establish devotion to her Immaculate Heart throughout the world, a point she repeated in future apparitions. catholiccompany.com

Pray the rosary every day. Resolve to practice of the Five First Saturdays devotion. Make an Act of Consecration to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. Save the date! Bishop Burbidge will visit us on Saturday, September 23, at 10:30am, to celebrate Holy Mass and confirm our parish's confirmation candidates. Rehearsal will be on Tues, Sept 19, 5:30pm. Parents of *confirmandi* should have received an important email about Confirmation. If you didn't receive it, please contact David: dwallace@sjtb.org.

In view of our upcoming Confirmation, let us continue to review in the CCC this Sacrament (part 6):

"Every baptized person not yet confirmed can and should receive the sacrament of Confirmation. Since Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist form a unity, it follows that 'the faithful are obliged to receive this sacrament at the appropriate time,' for without Confirmation and Eucharist, Baptism is certainly valid and efficacious, but Christian initiation remains incomplete. For centuries, Latin custom has indicated 'the age of discre-

tion' as the reference point for receiving Confirmation. But in danger of death children should be confirmed even if they have not vet attained the age of discretion. Although Confirmation is sometimes called the 'sacrament of Christian maturity,' we must not confuse adult faith with the adult age of natural growth, nor forget that the baptismal grace is a grace of free, unmerited election and does not need 'ratification' to become effective. St. Thomas reminds us of this: 'Age of body does not determine age of soul. Even in childhood man can attain spiritual maturity: as the book of Wisdom says: For old age is not honored for length of time, or measured by number of years. Many children, through the strength of the Holy Spirit they have received, have bravely fought for Christ even to the shedding of their blood.' *Preparation* for Confirmation should aim at leading the Christian toward a more intimate union with Christ and a more lively familiarity with the Holy Spirit - his actions, his gifts, and his biddings - in order to be more capable of assuming the apostolic responsibilities of Christian life. To this end catechesis for Confirmation should strive to awaken a sense of belonging to the Church of Jesus Christ, the universal Church as well as the parish community. The latter bears special responsibility for the preparation of confirmands. To receive Confirmation one must be in a state of grace. One should receive the sacrament of Penance in order to be cleansed for the gift of the Holy Spirit. More intense prayer should prepare one to receive the strength and graces of the Holy Spirit with docility and readiness to act. Candidates for Confirmation, as for Baptism, fittingly seek the spiritual help of a *sponsor*. To emphasize the unity of the two sacraments, it is appropriate that this be one of the baptismal godparents." (CCC 1306-1311)

VOCATIONS

*Crossing the bridge held captive by the Roman guards, Jesus is cast over the side bound in chains and there comes face to face with Judas, his betrayer. Consider the second and third order effects of our sins on those in our lives, especially our loved ones. Let us not separate ourselves from Christ through sin but seek to remain in close union with Him so that we may clearly hear His voice calling us to our vocation and follow Him.
