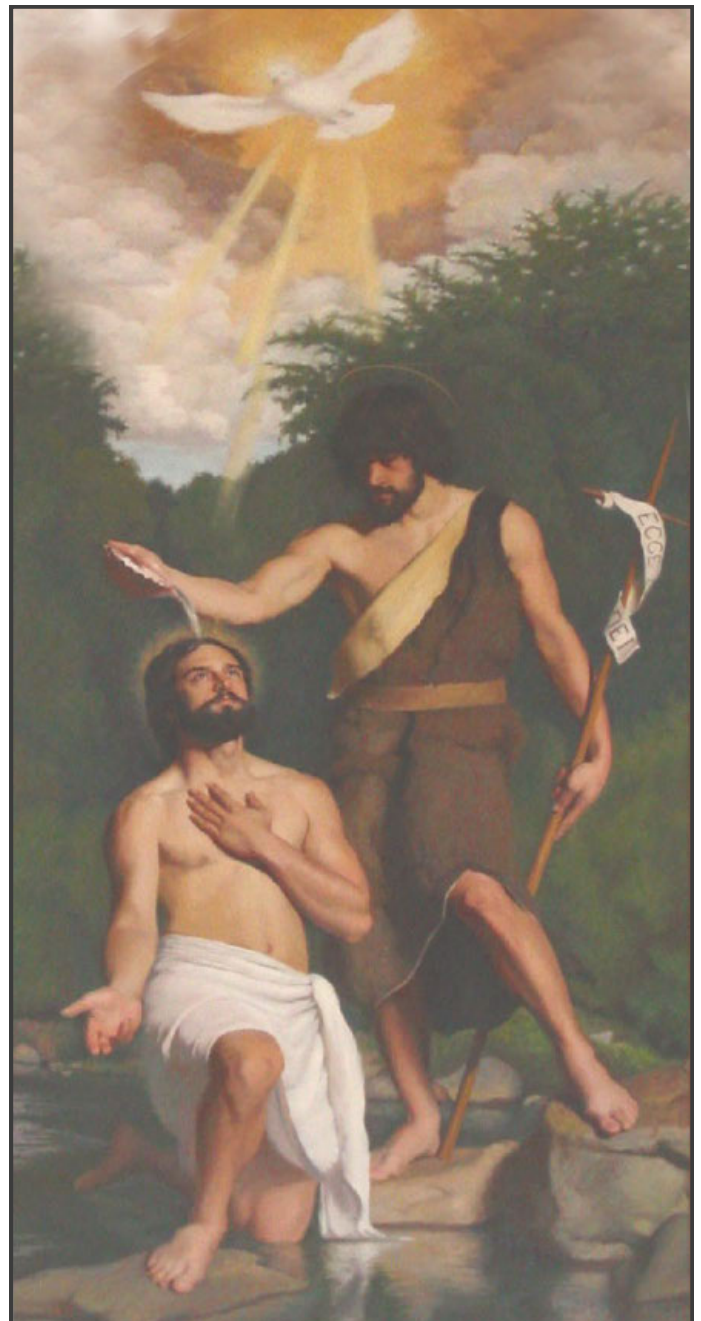

According to the Handbook of Indulgences, "A plenary indulgence, which is applicable only to the souls in purgatory, is granted the Christian faithful who devoutly visit a church or an oratory on All Souls Day." Also, "An indulgence is granted the Christian faithful who devoutly visit a cemetery and pray, if only mentally, for the dead. This indulgence is applicable only to the souls in purgatory. This indulgence is a plenary one from November 1 - 8 and can be gained on each one of these days. On the other days of the year this indulgence is a partial one."

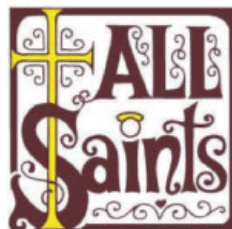
