

- + <u>Abstinence</u>: All Catholics, 14 years and older are bound by the Law of Abstinence to eat no meat (or meat byproducts) on Ash Wednesday and all Fridays in Lent.
- Fasting: All Catholics, from 18 to 59 years of age are bound by the Law of Fasting. Fasting means one full meal with two other light meals a day. There are only two days of fasting: Ash Wednesday & Good Friday.
