



LENT

Lent is a period of preparation to celebrate the Lord's Resurrection at Easter. During Lent, we seek the Lord in prayer by reading Sacred Scripture; we serve by giving alms; and we practice self-control through fasting. We are called not only to abstain from luxuries during Lent, but to a true inner conversion of heart as we seek to follow Christ's will more faithfully. We recall the waters of baptism in which we were also baptized into Christ's death, died to sin and evil, and began new life in Christ.



Many know of the tradition of abstaining from meat on Fridays during Lent, but we are also called to practice self-discipline and fast in other ways throughout the season. Contemplate the meaning and origins of the Lenten fasting tradition in this reflection. In addition, the giving of alms is one way to share God's gifts—not only through the distribution of money, but through the sharing of our time and talents. As St. John Chrysostom reminds us: "Not to enable the poor to share in our goods is to steal from them and deprive them of life. The goods we possess are not ours, but theirs." (Catechism of the

Catholic Church, no. 2446).

In Lent, the baptized are called to renew their baptismal commitment as others prepare to be baptized through the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults, a period of learning and discernment for individuals who have declared their desire to become Catholics.

"Wash away my iniquities cleanse me my sins" asks God to forgive sins and cleanse the soul; a request for mercy and forgiveness and reminder to live purely and devoutly, avoiding all sin. Those whose sins are pardoned must pray that the pardon may be more and more evidenced to them.

Sin is actions or thoughts that violate God's laws. As humans, we are naturally inclined toward sin. We are born with iniquity and our unrighteousness has separated us from God. We cannot overcome sin on our own.

Iniquity refers to an inborn unrighteousness and predisposition to sin, our sinful nature. Iniquity burdens us and keeps us apart from God. We are brought forth in iniquity. Our attempts to cleanse ourselves are futile.

Through Christ, God provided a way for us to be freed from sin and iniquity. Christ came to destroy the works of the devil, defeat sin, and cleanse us. His bloodshed washes us clean, as if we have not sinned at all. Christ's sacrifice offers redemption and freedom from sin and iniquity. Through Him, we find restoration and reconciliation with God.

Turn to Jesus - place your faith in His finished work, that you may fulfill yours.






