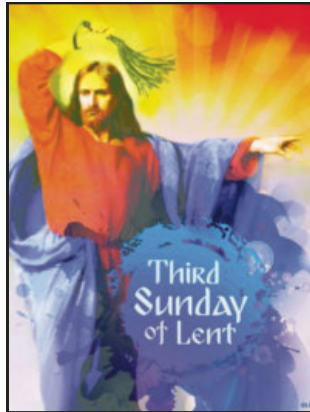

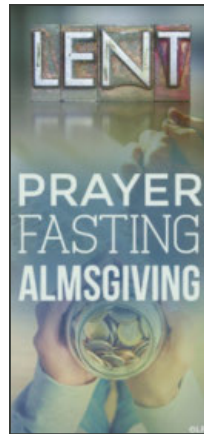

As a deer pants for flowing streams, so pants my soul for you, O God. My soul thirsts for God, for the living God. Psalm 42:1

Deer need water to survive. In the spirit, Jesus is our living water and we drink from Him. We are then restored, refreshed and strengthened.

Deer run to water for thirst, but they also run to water for safety and protection. When deer run to the water, it causes their enemies to not see them and lose their scent. This leaves the prowling enemy confused as to where the deer went. It's like this in the spirit as well. 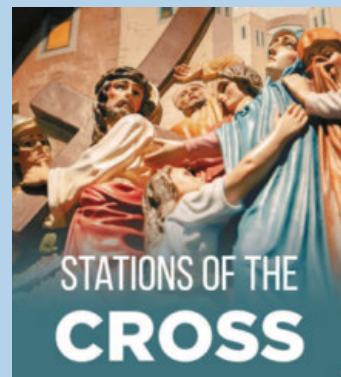

He devotes his time and energy hiding refugees, downed pilots, Italian Resistance families, escaped prisoners and allied POWs from the Nazi while building a network of hundreds of people who help him with his efforts.

His diplomatic status in a Catholic country prevents **Colonel Kappler (Christopher Plummer)** from openly arresting him, but Monsignor O'Flaherty's activities become so large that the Nazis decide to assassinate him the next time he leaves the Vatican.

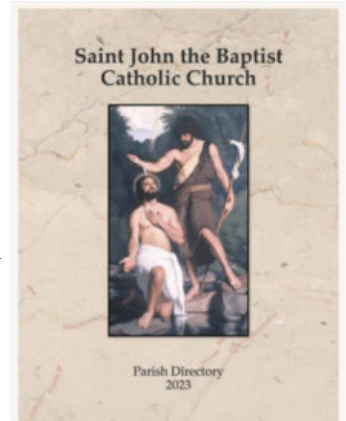

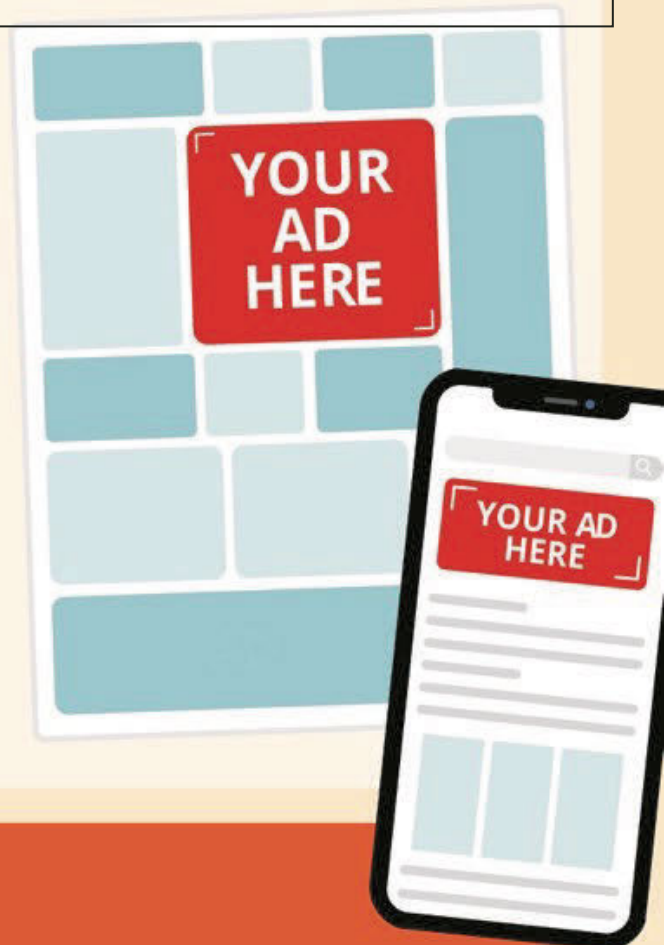
