

Care Packages for the Homeless:




Gift Cards for "Easter Baskets"

Second Collection, March 16-17: CETA Catholic Education Tuition Assistance

Next Weekend

The St John the Baptist Knights of Columbus Council 7771, under the guidance of our Pastor, Father Gee, has founded the **Catholic Education Tuition Assistance (CETA) fund to provide tuition assistance to parishioners with school age children in one of our eight, in-person parish schools.*** (Parishioners with school age children in public schools who wish their children to attend one of our in-person parish schools are also eligible to apply.) As these eight schools are not affiliated with Ar-lington's Diocesan Office of Catholic Schools and its Diocesan Scholarship Foundation, their students are ineligible to receive its tuition assistance. The CETA endowment seeks to bridge this gap and provide the needed financial support to parents whose children attend our local, in-person Catholic schools.

The CETA endowment will be funded by individual contributions, bequests, organizational donations as well as parish collections. One such collection will take place on the weekend of March 16-17, with the second collection on those days exclusively for the benefit of the CETA endowment. All funds collected will be used for tuition assistance, and monies will be paid directly to one of the eight schools on behalf of an individual child. Families will complete an application and the CETA committee will select individuals based on predetermined criteria. Information brochures and applications will be available after all Masses on the 16th and 17th. Vocation Awareness

May the road rise up to meet you. May the wind be always at your back. May the sun shine warm upon your face; the rains fall soft upon your fields and until we meet again, may God hold you in the palm of His hand.

"May the road rise to meet you" is an Irish blessing that has been passed down through generations. It is a traditional way of wishing someone good luck and fortune on their vocation through life. This blessing has a simple yet powerful message that has resonated with people all over the world.

Bearing its roots in Ireland, the prayer has three main images, namely wind, sun, and rain. The Irishman's deep connection to nature and Ireland's ever-changing elements shine through.

The reference to the wind is thought to be the Holy Spirit, who came as a "mighty wind" at Pentecost.

The sun's warmth alludes to God's mercy "by which the rising sun will come to us from heaven."

The mention of rain is symbolic of God's provision – nothing will grow without rain.

In Irish, the first line "Go n-éirí an bóthar leat" is more literally usually translated as "May you succeed on the road."




