



Surrender to God's Will

The Son, who redeems humanity through his death on the Cross, does not permit the slightest relief to his suffering: he does not want anything divine to hinder the fullness of his human suffering and dying. He now gives the Spirit of God back into the hands of the Father...both Son and Mother are utterly devoid of the Spirit; they have accomplished the ultimate loss, the Mother in the passiveness of "letting herself be sent away" and the Son in his action. From this moment, the Son begins his "being merely passive" on the Cross, which contains the Mother's "having become passive". This is a new form of his acceptance of the human, the acceptance of the Mother by the Son at this ultimate extreme of redemption in death. She does not die with him, but she is handed over into his death through the sending off of the Spirit.

The Son now glorifies the Father on the Cross by robbing himself of the Spirit, and the Spirit brings with him this glorification when he is given back into the Father's hands.
