



#### **Vocation Awareness**

"May the working of Thy power, we beg Thee, O Lord, be increased in us, that, being nourished by divine sacraments, we may by Thy grace be prepared to obtain that which they promise." – Postcommunion, Ordinary of Mass How do the sacraments produce grace?

1. The first five sacraments especially perfect the individual, while the last two perfect society.

2. The sacraments of the dead (baptism and penance) give grace to anyone spiritually dead through original or mortal sin, while the sacraments of the living (confirmation, Eucharist, extreme unction, holy orders, matrimony) increase grace in those who are already in the state of grace.

3. Christ is present in every sacrament by His power and action, but in the Eucharist also by His permanent and substantial presence.

4. Three sacraments imprint an indelible character (baptism, confirmation, holy orders) upon the soul and so may only be received once, while the others do not imprint a character and may be received more than once. -Credo, 238



# HOPE AND REST TEMPORARY SHELTER

The Front Royal HARTS shelter has been a beacon of hope and support for those who find themselves without a place to call home over the winter months. Every winter the homeless shelter opens its doors to individuals who have fallen on hard times, facing the harsh reality of homelessness. HARTS strives to offer more than just a roof overhead, they aim to restore dignity, provide vital resources and empower those in need to regain stability and independence. They provide warm meals, clean clothing, access to showers and laundry facilities. The comprehensive support programs include working with community providers to offer job training, education assistance, mental health counseling and access to medical care.

None of this would be possible without the generosity of individuals like you! As the shelter closes for the season, it is of great value to look ahead to the coming year and make plans with the resources we have. This past year we were able to plan to stay open for an additional 3 weeks because of donations received prior to opening in December. Please consider making a donation to the shelter so that we can continue to offer these essential services that give hope to those who have lost their way.

Here are some ways your contribution can make a difference:

- \$100 provides an entire week of shelter for one of our guests
- \$140 provides a bed set and cot for one individual
- \$2600 provides 1 week of payroll
