Month of May ~ Month of Our Blessed Lady



The month of May is the "month which the piety of the faithful has especially dedicated to Our Blessed Lady," and it is the occasion for a "moving tribute of faith and love which Catholics in every part of the world [pay] to the Queen of Heaven. During this month Christians, both in church and in the privacy of the home, offer up to Mary from their hearts an especially fervent and loving homage of prayer and veneration. In this month, too, the benefits of God's mercy come down to us from her throne in greater abundance." (Paul VI: *Encyclical on the Month of May*).

How can we honor Mary this month? Keep fresh flowers near a Marian statue in your home; make a pilgrimage to a church dedicated to Mary; add the Litany of Loreto to your rosary; be more attentive in your recitation of the rosary; perform works of charity.

The latest purchase is in Winchester, VA, representing an expansion out of the Northern Virginia area. This significant expansion is part of a broader Capital Campaign to raise \$250,000 for the purchase and refurbishment of the home, which will accommodate four to five intellectually disabled adults seeking independent living solutions.

Founded in 1996 by the St. Mary of Sorrows Council 8600 of the Knights of Columbus, Marian Homes, Inc., has been a cornerstone in the community, working closely with donors, partners, and local government agencies to create living spaces that currently serve 40 individuals. The organization's commitment to enhancing the lives of intellectually disabled adults by providing them a place to live independently as their parents age is more critical than ever.

"We are calling on the community to help us transform this house into a home where four more individuals can live productively and contribute to society," said Jim McHugh, Marian Homes, Inc. President. "Our residents are capable of living full and active lives but often cannot do so alone. With your help, we can provide them with the independence they deserve."

Intellectually disabled adults face unique challenges, and as they grow older, especially when their parents can no longer care for them, they require specialized living arrangements. Marian Homes fulfills this need by offering a place where they can live with dignity among peers. This model not only supports the individuals but also provides peace of mind to their families, knowing their loved ones are in a safe, caring environment.

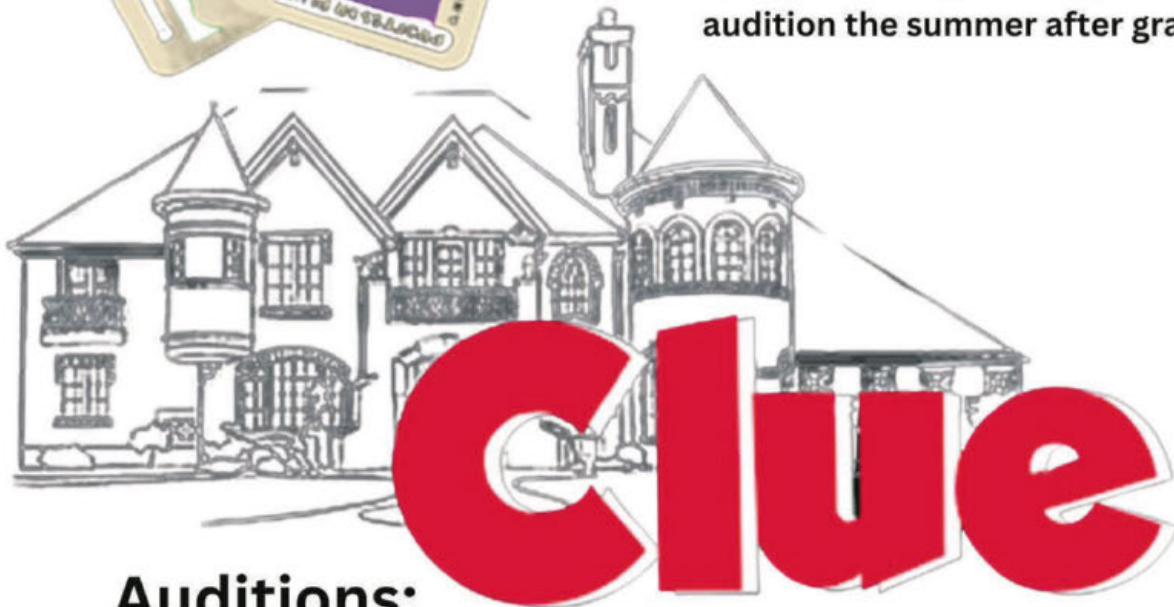
