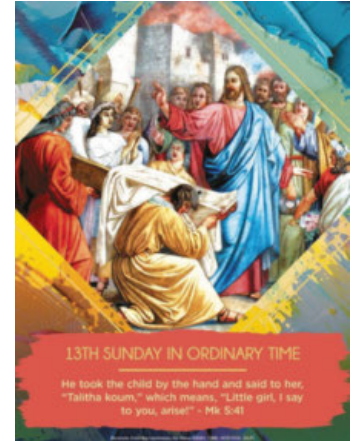

Finding Jesus with Saints Francis and Clare - Men's and Women's Retreat

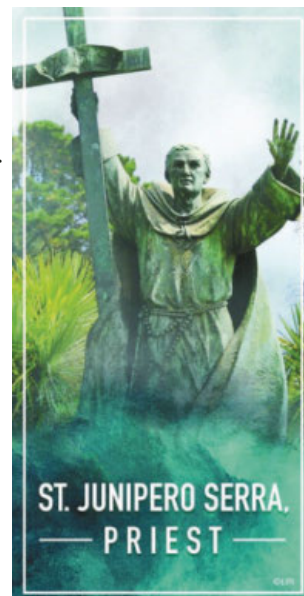

Raising Arrows

Like arrows in the hand of a warrior are the children of one's youth. Psalm 127:4

A good arrow is specified to the bow used in order to get an accurate shot. It is the proper length for the bow with the right amount of flex for the bow. If either trait is off, the arrow will not fly accurately. So if children are like arrows in a warrior's hand, then parents must be precise and intentional with how they raise them so that they are ready to fly straight when the time comes.

Direct your children onto the right path, and when they are older, they will not leave it. Proverbs 22:6

When we direct our children onto the right path, when we intentionally pour God's love and Word into them, when we work to keep the soil of our children fertile, then the seeds we scatter will take root and produce a crop that is one hundred times more than was planted. When the time comes for that child to leave his father and mother, they will not stray from the path; instead, they will fly straight and true.

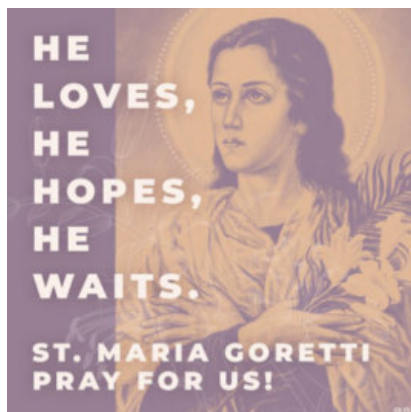
