New Alcoholics Anonymous Meeting at St. John's

There is now an Open meeting of Alcoholics Anonymous that meets every Friday evening from 8-9 pm in Padre Pio Hall.

It is an "Open" meeting which means anyone who wonders if they may have an issue related to drinking is welcome to attend. It is the revival of an old Meeting at St. John's that met at the same time many years ago and was a centerpiece of recovery for many people. It is being started by members of St. John's already in recovery in the hope of being able to bring the message to those who need it.

It is, however, an ANONYMOUS meeting meaning:

Who you see there, What you hear there, when you leave there, let it stay there.

Divine Mercy Ministry for the Dying



One of the most powerful promises Jesus relayed to Saint Faustina relates to praying the Divine Mercy Chaplet for those who are dying:

“When this chaplet is said by the bedside of a dying person, God’s anger is placated, unfathomable mercy envelops the soul, and the very depths of My tender mercy are moved for the sake of the sorrowful Passion of My Son.” (Diary, 811)

St. John’s Divine Mercy Ministry for the Dying

has an **active** team that will go to the bedside to pray the chaplet at the request of the family as well as a **contemplative** team that will pray privately. “My daughter, encourage souls to say the chaplet which I have given to you... Write that when they say this chaplet in the presence of the dying, I will stand between My Father and the dying person, not as the just Judge but as the merciful Savior.” (Diary, 1541)

The Flame of Love, A New Church Approved Devotion and Grace



Our Lady's promise to Elizabeth Kindelmann of Hungary: "By my Flame of Love, a new era of grace, never before known on the earth, will begin." In the approved diary of Elizabeth's, three times it is stated that the Flame of Love is the greatest outpouring of grace since the Word became Flesh.

What is the Flame of Love?

The Flame of Love is an extraordinary grace which comes from Mary's Immaculate Heart to us at this time in history. It is an initiative by the Most Holy Virgin, that may be summed up as follows: Satan intensifies his efforts to ruin souls. His eternal opponent is the Most Blessed Virgin Mary. She obtained from the heavenly Father, by the merits of the Passion of her Most Holy son, an outpouring of graces so great as have not existed since the Word became Flesh (the words of our Most Holy Mother). She will blind Satan with the Flame of light and grace which bursts forth from her Immaculate Heart. The Unity Prayer blinds Satan for a period of time.

You are invited to pray the Flame of Love rosary on Mondays after the noon mass. Jesus said, "**Because of the Holy Virgin's efficacious pleas, the Most Blessed Trinity granted the outpouring of the Flame of Love....**"

From the approved Diary of Elizabeth Kindelmann:

Jesus: "The face of the earth will be renewed because something like this has not happened since the Word became Flesh."

Mary: "As the number who sacrifice increases, the Flame will grow greater. The brilliance of my Flame of Love will fill the whole earth."

Mary: "While someone is at Adoration or visiting the Blessed Sacrament, Satan loses his dominion. As a blind man, he ceases to rule over souls."

Jesus: "Through this prayer (the Unity Prayer), Satan will be blind and souls will not be led into sin."

Mary: "If at any moment, someone prays three Hail Mary's in my honor, while referring to the Flame of Love, they will free a soul from purgatory."

Mary: "As the number who sacrifice increases, the Flame will grow greater. The brilliance of my Flame of Love will fill the whole earth."


